

Comb-Grown Goodness

Banana Bread

Joy with Honey by Doris Mech

1 c unbleached white flour

1 ¼ c whole wheat flour

½ t salt

1 t baking soda

½ c butter

¾ c honey

2 eggs, beaten

1 c mashed ripe banana, about 3

2-3 T hot water

½ c chopped walnuts

In medium bowl, stir together first 4 ingredients. In heavy pan on low heat, melt butter, remove from heat, and stir in honey. Add eggs and bananas and stir vigorously. Stir in about half of the dry ingredients, then half the hot water. Add the rest of the dry ingredients and the rest of the host water. Stir in nuts. Fill a greased and floured loaf pan and bake at 325 for 70 minutes or until brown and starting to pull away from the edge of the pan. Cool in pan on a rack.
